This course will evaluate your ability to read, write, listen to, speak and watch authentic Spanish language in action. This summer assignment is developed to allow you to practice these skills over the summer, as to retain the knowledge that you have acquired over the past three years. The assignment is the bare minimum, and I encourage you to go above and beyond. For example, watch your favorite movie dubbed over in Spanish, look up some awesome new artists online, buy their music and memorize their songs, or watch news and/or sports in Spanish. Basically, follow your passions and find their Spanish speaking equivalent! I have numerous links on my personal page at our school's website that are wonderful resources that you can begin to explore now.

With that being said, I understand that summers can be busy and I do not expect that you spend hours on these assignments every week. However, I do expect that you practice your Spanish regularly and improve your skills over the summer. This assignment is designed to provide continual use of the language all summer long which in turn will directly impact your performance in the course.

The following activities are the **minimum** requirements to be completed by all students enrolled in Spanish IV/AP. The entire assignment is due on Friday, August 12th in Google Classroom by 11:59 p.m. and it's worth 80 points. You may use a Spanish to English dictionary like <u>www.wordreference.com</u>.
